Co-op Education Incentive



 NSERC Experience Awards offer organizations access to talented natural sciences and engineering undergraduate students for a work term. The cost-shared program allows students to address organization specific R&D challenges while gaining valuable industrial experience. For employers – this is an opportunity to identify potential future full-time employees.

 Valuable work experience is offered with a number of federal organizations through the FSWEP and Co-op Education and Internship Program. Students must be studying in Canada and be returning to full-time studies. Canadian citizens will be given preference. Part-time throughout the year; full time in summer.

- Deadlines vary for each program; please review program websites for current information.
- Co-op work terms must be a minimum of 12-13 weeks and include at least 32.5 hours per week.
- The Co-op office strongly recommends early applications. Please review all requirements thoroughly to ensure your organization is considered for funding.



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Student Work Placement Program (SWPP)

 an initiative to increase the job-readiness of students registered in STEM, healthcare, business, and all other programs at Canadian post-secondary institutions. Covering the cost of a student's salary by 50% up to a maximum of \$5,000 and 70% up to a maximum of \$7,000.

 helps entrepreneurial led companies based in the HRM area hire SMU students. Can cover up to \$3,412.50 per hire.

Energy Training Program

 Wage subsidies are available for small to medium-sized Nova Scotia companies involved in the energy sector. Employers receive up to 50% (up to \$7.50 an hour) of the student or graduate's wages for a 12 to 17-week work term.
